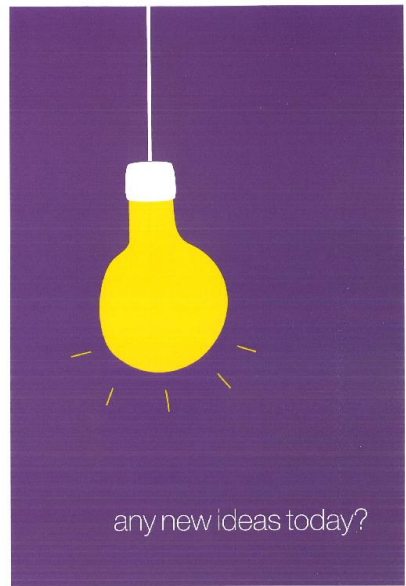

Forms of Financing

Forms of financing

1. What are the main types of financing from the EU budget?

Are you looking for money to **fund** your project?

GRANTS

awarded to **co-finance** specific projects or objectives, usually through **calls for proposals**

Are you looking for opportunities to **sell** your services or goods?

PUBLIC CONTRACTS

awarded through **calls for tenders** (public procurement) to **buy services, goods or works** in order to ensure the operations of EU institutions or programmes

2. Who is managing the money and decides on awarding grants/contracts?

EU Member States

Over 76% of the EU budget is managed by national and regional authorities. This includes **structural funds** and **agricultural subsidies**.

European Commission

Roughly 22% are centrally managed programmes (e.g. in research, education, health, youth actions).

Third countries and international organisations (e.g. Red Cross, UN): 2%.

Characteristics

- ☀ **European Dimension**
- ☀ **Competitive**
- ☀ **Transnational Cooperation**
- ☀ **Support of projects or organisations which further the interests of the EU or contribute to the implementation of an EU programme or policy**
- ☀ **Non profit character**

Structural Funds

Characteristics

- ✦ **Decentralised management and selection of projects (national or/and regional level)**
- ✦ **Adjusted to the socioeconomic challenges faced by the individual member states or regions**
- ✦ **Application procedures are set by the Managing Authorities of individual states**

Application Procedure



How do I apply?

- For EU grants, application procedures are set out in the calls for proposals for specific programmes, and you will apply directly to the European Commission or an executive agency which runs the programme in question.
- Programmes funded through structural funds are managed at national or regional level, where the projects are selected.
- Financial instruments for SMEs are usually available through financial intermediaries such as banks or credit institutions.

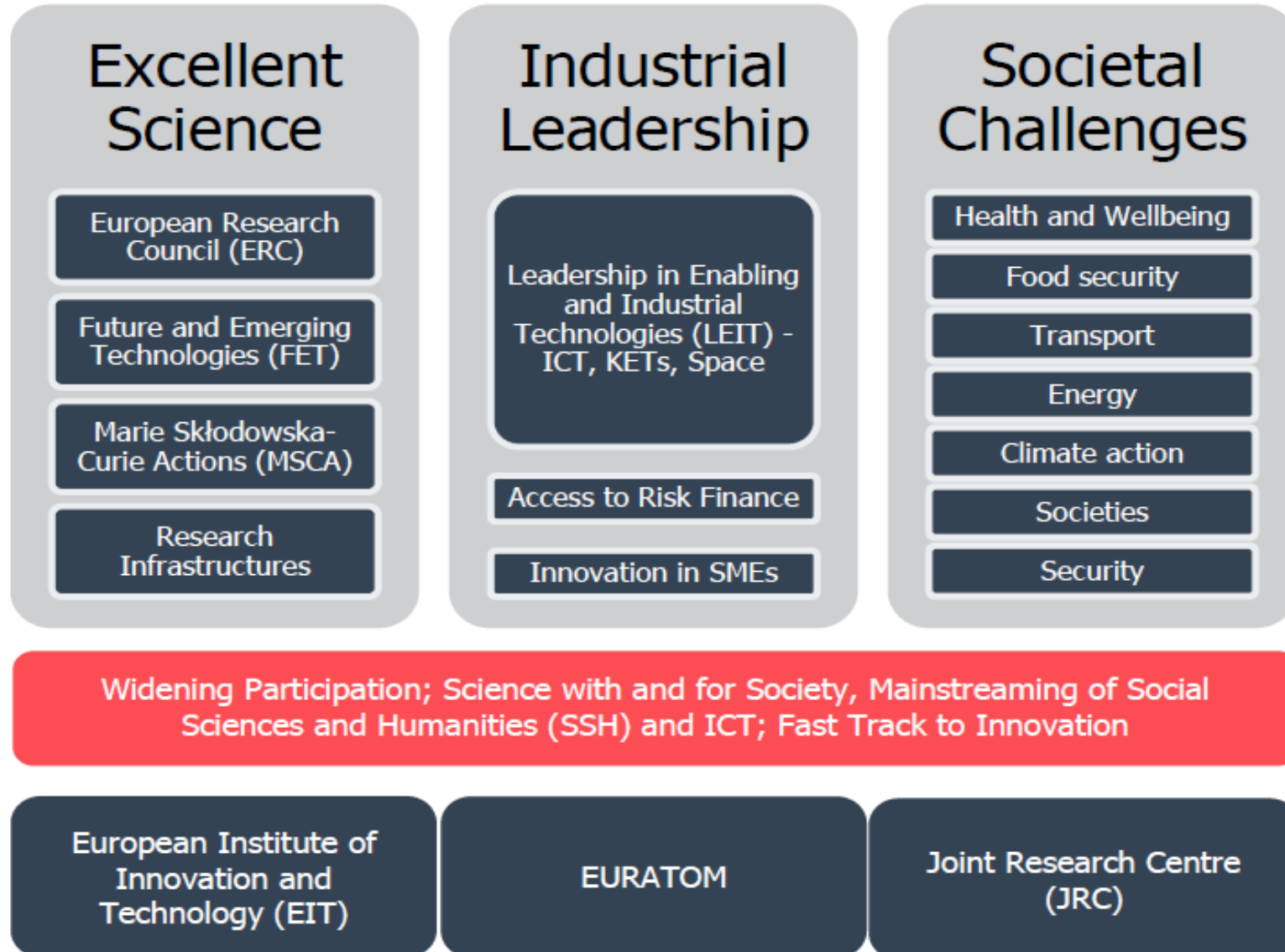

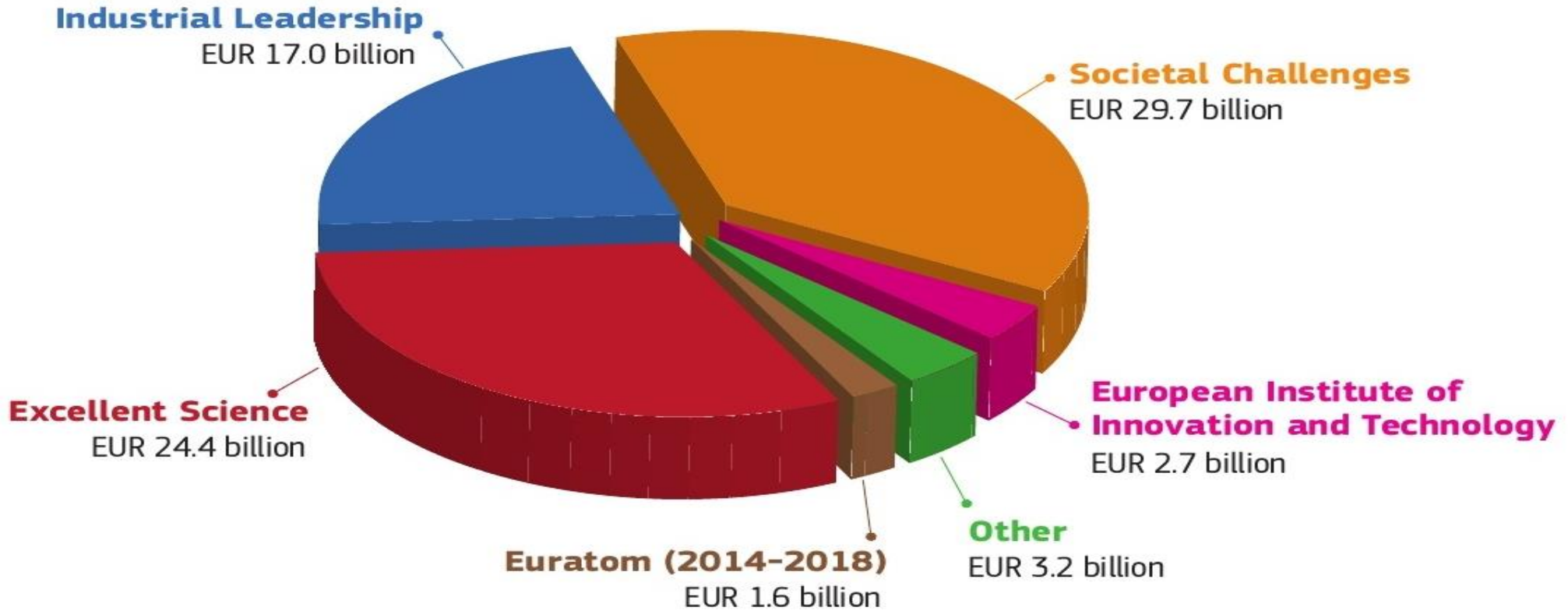

Strategic Partnerships

- ❑ **Sectoral and cross-sectoral structured cooperation** (education, training and youth + other relevant stakeholders) to implement **innovative practices** leading to **high quality teaching, training and learning and youth work, institutional modernisation and social innovation**
- ❑ **Activities ranging from small scale projects** (i.e. allowing access for newcomers) **to more ambitious, larger scale projects**
- ❑ Fully **decentralised management** to enable better consideration of the national context and achieve maximum impact

Strategic Partnerships in Higher Education

Large **flexibility**, as long as activities are linked to the objectives of the Action and most appropriate to reach the specific objectives of the project.

Develop, test, adapt and implement innovative practices:

1. **Joint study programmes & joint curricula, IPs & common modules – including e-modules**
2. **Project-based trans-national collaboration between enterprises & students/staff at HEIs**
3. **Pedagogical approaches and methodologies, including through a better exploitation of ICTs – especially aimed at delivering transversal competences, entrepreneurial mind-set and creative thinking**
4. **Integration of a greater variety of study modes** (distance, part-time, modular learning), notably through new forms of learning and strategic use of ICT, open educational resources and virtual mobility
5. **Cooperation and exchange of practice between staff responsible for support services** (guidance counselling; coaching methods and tools; etc.) or those involved in student support services

Knowledge Alliances

- ❑ Knowledge Alliances are **structured partnerships** bringing together **higher education institutions and enterprises** to develop innovative ways of producing and sharing knowledge, to design and deliver new curricula and ways of learning that will foster creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship in higher education and enterprise

- ❑ **Examples of group activities:**
 - Boosting innovation in higher education, business and in the broader socio-economic environment;
 - Developing entrepreneurship mind-set and skills;
 - Stimulating the flow and exchange of knowledge between higher education and enterprises.

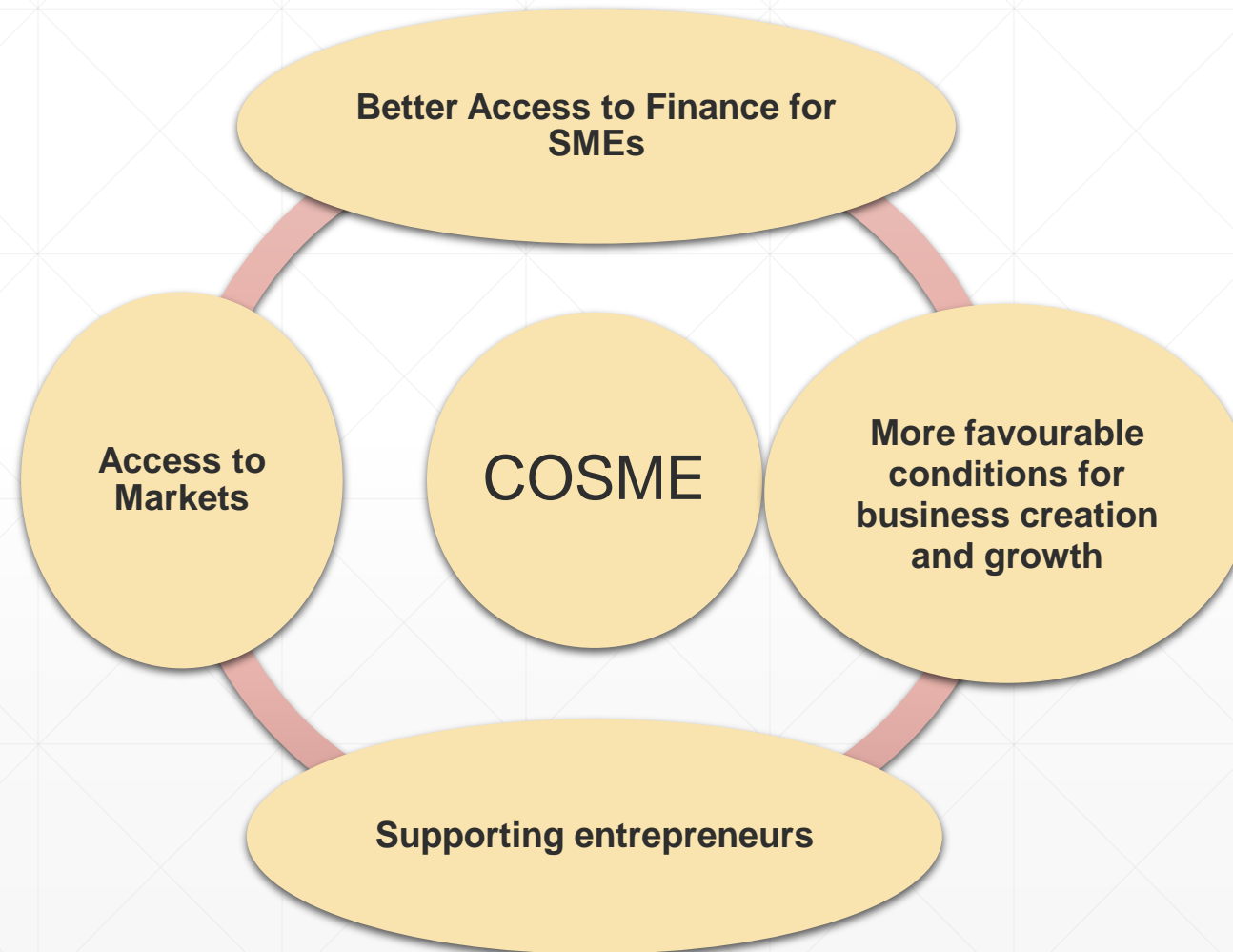
It aims:

Creative Europe Programme 2014-2020

The Creative Europe programme aims at helping cultural and creative organisations to operate transnationally, the circulation of works of culture as well as the mobility of cultural players.

"Creative Europe" is made of 3 parts:

- the "**Culture sub-programme**" for cultural & creative sectors
- the "**Media sub-programme**" for the audio-visual industries
- the **Cross-sectoral strand** for joint projects between the cultural & creative sectors and the audio-visual industries.

The budget for the programme is **EUR 1,46 billion over the period 2014-2020.**

Justice Programme offers concrete financial support to various organisations specialised thematically in the area of justice.



JUSTICE Programme 2014-2020

It focuses on the following key areas:

- **judicial cooperation in civil matters**, including civil and commercial matters, insolvencies, family matters and successions, etc.
- **judicial cooperation in criminal matters**
- **judicial training**, including language training on legal terminology, with a view to fostering a common legal and judicial culture
- **effective access to justice in Europe**, including rights of victims of crime and procedural rights in criminal proceedings
- **initiatives in the field of drugs policy** (judicial cooperation and crime prevention aspects)

The budget for the programme is **EUR 378 million over the period 2014-2020.**
